Paul explains to the Romans that Adam's sin brought death to all, but Christ's gift of himself brought grace and life.

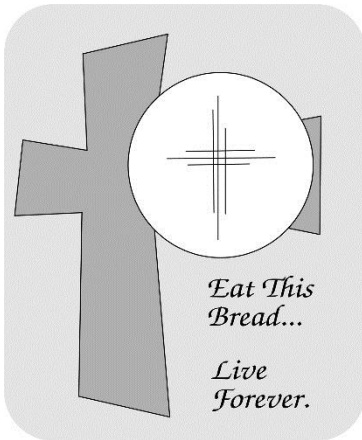
Gospel: Matthew 10:26-33
